Thesis Title: "Fijian Perspectives in Mathematics Education"

Adi Salaneta Bakalevu is a very experienced Fijian mathematics teacher who studied mathematics education at the Centre for Science, Mathematics and Technology Education Research during 1994 to upgrade her BEd to a BEd(Hons) to enable her to begin her doctoral studies. She then spent three and a half years doing research for her doctorate which was completed this year. Sala's thesis topic was "Fijian Perspectives in Mathematics Education". She looked at mathematical ideas from traditional and contemporary Fijian life that might be used to enrich school mathematics in Fiji, empower Fijian learners, and assist in the revitalisation of Fijian culture. Her approach was through an ethnographic methodology and while the mathematical focus involved counting, measuring, location, relations, and patterns and design, her study considered learning, language, and culture, and the interplay between these. Sala's thesis provides an excellent basis for future studies relating to everyday activities to school mathematics, it raises some important issues concerning research methods with indigenous people, and interesting questions about language and mathematics.
