Hamilton

Due to open in 2023, the University is currently building an innovative and versatile new facility at the Hamilton campus, The Pā, which will transform the on-campus experience for students, staff, visitors and the broader community.


Tauranga

Our award-winning Tauranga campus, just three years old, offers a modern learning environment that is a stone's throw from the beautiful Tauranga waterfront and downtown shopping precinct.

The state-of-the-art building was designed with students in mind, and displays stunning artworks that express a unique cultural narrative that reflects the relationship with mana whenua and, more broadly, with Tauranga Moana and Bay of Plenty iwi. The University also operates dedicated facilities in Tauranga for coastal marine and aquaculture research, as well as high performance sport.

China

The University has around 900 students at its joint institute with Zhejiang University City College (ZUCC) in China. The purpose-built institute, designed with New Zealand design principles, teaching approaches and standards, offers degrees in Finance, Computer Graphic Design and Design Media.
